BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:

The donor, John David Hinkle, grew up in Dayton, Va. His father, John Ray Hinkle, was born Nov. 18, 1904, in Grant Co., W.Va., and attended Shenandoah College, Dayton, Va., in the 1920s. Hinkle moved to Dayton in 1942 and died there on Nov. 14, 1992. While living in Dayton, Hinkle served as a minister, operated Hinkle's Card Shop, and founded his own advertising specialty firm, John Ray Hinkle C.A. Service. He also sold books for the Reubush-Kieffer publishing company. He married Nellie Mauzy, of Frederick Co., on April 1, 1933.

SCOPE AND CONTENT:

Collection contains miscellaneous materials, mainly relating to Shenandoah College, that passed down to the donor from his parents, John Ray Hinkle and Nellie Mauzy Hinkle. Also included are documents pertaining to Nellie and her brother, Hulvey Enoch Mauzy. Twelve publications, primarily Reubush-Kieffer hymnals, were placed in the HRHS Rare Book Collection (See HRHS Rare Book Register for listing). Four "Movie Chatter" entertainment newspapers, published by the Shenandoah Press in Dayton, were placed in the HRHS Newspaper Collection (HRHS-91).
