BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE: The Stirewalt family moved to the New Market-Harrisonburg area from North Carolina in the 1840's and were widely known through their association with education and the Lutheran clergy. Jacob L. Stirewalt held jobs in Harrisonburg and Roanoke in the 1880's before returning to New Market where he went into business. Annie (?) in Port Republic has not been identified.

W. J. Stirewalt lived in New Market and Harrisonburg and was the father of Sue Stirewalt Lane. He lived in Harrisonburg from 1930 – 1940.

SCOPE AND CONTENT: Miscellaneous letters, booklets, and calendars. Love letters written to Jacob L. Stirewalt by Annie (?), Riverside, Port Republic, in the 1880s. These letters cover a period of 6-8 years, and provide information regarding the area at that time, namely, the optimistic 1880's and young people in rural Rockingham Co. So too, does one feel Annie's unrequited love and unfulfilled hope for her future.
