BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:

Floyd Wilmer Coffman was born in Rockingham County, September 14, 1889. He was called to duty in the U.S. Army to serve in WWI, August, 1917 as a field clerk with the Quartermaster Corps, and was discharged August 10, 1919. Mr. Coffman attended LaSalle University in Chicago IL from 1921-1924, but did not earn a degree.

Mr. Coffman had a special interest in photography, and apprenticed at William Dean's photographic studio in Harrisonburg from 1911-1916, during which time which he also studied photography at the Eastman School for Professional Photographers. From 1916-1925 Mr. Coffman was a junior partner at Wm. B. Dutrow Co., a small department store in Harrisonburg. Professionally, from 1925-1942, Mr. Coffman was treasurer and manager of Sisler Brothers, a manufacturer of fabricated sonte and cement blocks, including granites, marbles, soapstone, slate and limestone. Coffman was appointed to the Harrisonburg City Council in 1938 and was re-elected for a four year term in 1940. He wrote three books: Rockingham County in the World War (1931), 140 pages; The Conrad Clan, an historical biography (1939), 400 pages; Our Fledgling Air Corps (pub date?). He was married to Mona Lyon who worked at Madison College.
